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## Project Overview

As the *Rx for Survival—A Global Health Challenge* television series and its related multimedia coverage make clear, there is a growing crisis in global health. Child survival is one global health challenge about which every American can quickly and easily make a dramatic difference. The WGBH Educational Foundation and Vulcan Productions have created *Rx for Child Survival*, an outreach campaign to raise awareness about child survival issues and encourage people to speak out, volunteer time and energy, and donate money to programs that give the world's most vulnerable children a fighting chance at life.

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## *Rx for Child Survival* Interventions

Worldwide more than 10 million children under the age of five die each year—a majority from preventable causes—and experts agree that nearly all of them would have had a much better chance at life if they had access to simple, inexpensive health interventions:

- Vaccinations to fight childhood diseases, including measles and tetanus
- Vitamin A and micronutrients to meet the minimum requirements for healthy growth
- Oral rehydration packets to help reduce diarrhea-related illness and deaths
- Insecticide-treated netting to protect against mosquitoes that carry malaria and other infectious diseases
- Antibiotics to fight pneumonia and antimalarials

Funds donated to the *Rx for Child Survival* campaign will be used by Save the Children and CARE to deliver these interventions. CARE will also distribute a percentage of the *Rx for Child Survival* donations to UNICEF for the purchase of vaccines. Additionally, where it is appropriate, pregnant women and new mothers will be educated about the health value of breastfeeding their infants.

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## *Rx for Child Survival* Countries Served

Interventions will be delivered to children in Sierra Leone, Vietnam, Mozambique, Nicaragua, Mali, Nepal and Afghanistan.

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## ***Rx for Child Survival Partners***

*Rx for Child Survival*—A *Global Health Challenge* is a project of the WGBH Educational Foundation and Vulcan Productions in collaboration with CARE and Save the Children, and in association with the Global Health Council and UNICEF. Save the Children and CARE have offices, trained staff and delivery systems in the world's neediest countries, and they will efficiently and effectively distribute necessary healthcare measures to the most vulnerable children; in addition, CARE will distribute a percentage of the *Rx for Child Survival* donations to UNICEF for the purchase of vaccines. As the largest member organization devoted to improving health around the world, the Global Health Council is a natural partner in WGBH and Vulcan Productions' efforts to raise Americans' awareness about health.

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## ***Rx for Child Survival Outreach Partners***

A number of humanitarian, professional and community partners will be central to raising Americans' awareness by sharing information with their constituencies and through existing and specially created activities. These outreach partners are: American Academy of Pediatrics; American Public Health Association; The CORE Group; Girl Scouts of the USA; Global Alliance for Vaccines & Immunization (GAVI); National Public Health Information Coalition; the Pan American Health Organization; Rotary International; The United Nations Association–USA; and U.S. Coalition for Child Survival.

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## ***Rx for Child Survival Community Coalitions***

PBS stations from Seattle to Atlanta have stepped forward to serve as community coalitions, galvanizing Americans' awareness and engagement in global health and child survival. Anchored by the stations, the community coalitions have partnered with local branches of the 10 national outreach partners and with a variety of organizations and institutions within their communities. From the end of summer and well into 2006, the coalitions will organize a host of activities from screenings and panel discussions to child survival fundraisers and local public affairs programming.
