A veteran both behind the scenes and in front of the camera, Sissy brings unrestrained curiosity and her trademark creative energy to segments that bring the outdoors into the home. Sissy emphasizes the connection between the garden and the table, working with the country's top chefs to serve up recipes that use the freshest of produce. She also puts her talents to work crafting ideas to make the most of every aspect of the garden and show you how to decorate and entertain — using what you grow.

Sissy joined *The Victory Garden* with a wealth of experience, most recently serving the Lillian Vernon Corporation as the company's lifestyle editor and spokesperson. In collaboration with NBCUniversal Digital Studios, Sissy created *A Big Life with Sissy Biggers* for msn.com, online at <http://abiglife.msn.com/>, which treats viewers to weekly lifestyle, travel, entertaining, cooking, and family adventures. During her career, she was anchor of *Live from Queens*, and co-host of *Biggers & Summers* with Marc Summers, both on Lifetime; and host and consulting producer of the popular *Ready Set Cook!* on The Food Network. Sissy has also contributed her on-air talents to NBC's *Later Today Show*, the *Today Show*, the *Rosie O'Donnell Show*, CBS' *The Early Show*; and other programs include *Weekend Today*, *The Other Half*, *The Christopher Lowell Show*, *The View*, *Late Night with Conan O'Brien*, *Extra!*, *Extreme Makeover*, and *Living it up with Ali & Jack*.

Her behind-the-scenes experience includes working in comedy production for ABC and HBO; and Director of Late Night and Specials Programming for NBC in where she worked on such classic programs as *Saturday Night Live* and *Late Night with David Letterman*. She was also the consulting producer of the James Beard Award-winning special, *Food Trip with Todd English*, which sent her to Tokyo to produce the series pilot episode.

Sissy, her husband, Kelsey and their two daughters, Sarah and Lucy, live

in Connecticut where she is a dedicated community volunteer, home cook and energetic hostess. Sissy received her degree in English and French literature at Columbia University's Barnard College. Through her company, Big Sis Productions, Sissy is a consulting producer for lifestyle television and creates broadcast media messaging for television, radio and live events representing many national brands, including Arm & Hammer Baking Soda, the National PTA, AOL Time-Warner, General Mills and the 3M Company. As an event-marketing producer and host, she appears annually at the *Food & Wine Magazine* annual Classic Cook-Off in Aspen, Colorado.

The *Victory Garden* airs its 32nd season in 2007/2008, continuing to inspire, educate, and entertain seasoned and amateur gardeners alike.
